



HLTAID007 Provide advanced resuscitation

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to use specialised equipment in the provision of resuscitation in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines.

This unit applies to workers who may be required to use specialised equipment to provide resuscitation in a range of complex situations, include community and workplace settings.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will have the skills and knowledge to use specialized equipment to provide resuscitation in complex situations.

Blended delivery mode:

Pre-course study – the Learner Guide is emailed to the learner as a pdf document one week prior to attending the face to face class training of supervised instruction.

The learner is then required to attend a class of training and assessment involving practical demonstrations.

Course duration – Class delivery and times:

Eight (8) hours – 9.00am to 5.30pm with a half an hour lunch break.

Entry requirements:

There are no formal entry requirements for persons seeking enrolment into this qualification.

Competent in written and spoken English

Students are required to be competent in written and spoken English to gain entry to the course. A Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment is a mandatory requirement prior to enrolment. Oral communication is very important in order to make an accurate verbal report to emergency response services and workplace supervisor.

Physical requirements:

It is important to note that HLTAID competency standards do require a level of physical ability to meet the evidence requirements for assessment. These standards relate to the level of performance required to provide resuscitation and respond to an emergency situation where there may be risk to life.

It is a Training Package requirement of this course that you are physically capable of performing uninterrupted CPR for at least 2 minutes on a CPR manikin situated on the floor and at least a further 6 minutes in different situations for at least 2 minutes for each scenario demonstrating resuscitation techniques.

Course Structure

Theory—Knowledge—you will learn and be assessed on:

- State/Territory regulation, first aid codes of practice and workplace procedures
- Legal, workplace and community considerations
- Considerations when performing resuscitation
- Considerations when providing supplementary oxygen
- Basic anatomy, physiology and toxicology as it relates to the provision of advanced resuscitation
- Methods for cleaning, replenishing, recharging and maintaining resuscitation and oxygen equipment

Practical demonstrations—Skills—you will be assessed responding to first aid scenarios in a simulated workplace environment and expected to perform demonstrations:

- Follow DRSABCD in line with ARC guidelines, including:
 - perform at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) (5 cycles of both compressions and ventilations) on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor
 - perform at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer CPR (5 cycles both compressions and ventilations) on an infant resuscitation manikin placed on a firm surface
 - perform at least 2 minutes of bag-valve-mask ventilation and at least 2 minutes of compression on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor
 - respond appropriately in the event of regurgitation or vomiting
 - manage the unconscious breathing casualty
 - follow the prompts of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
 - follow single rescue procedure, including the demonstration of a rotation of operators with minimal interruptions to compressions
 - conducted a visual and verbal secondary survey assessment of the casualty
 - assessed vital signs (respirations, pulse and temperature)
- Respond to at least three simulated first aid scenarios contextualised to the candidate's workplace/community setting, including:
 - demonstrate safe manual handling techniques
 - clearing the airway using a suction device
 - post-incident debrief and evaluation
 - provide an accurate verbal and written report of the incident
 - select and inserted an oropharyngeal airway adjunct
- Administer oxygen to an unconscious/conscious casualty, following correct procedures for the equipment
- Located and interpreted workplace policies and procedures
